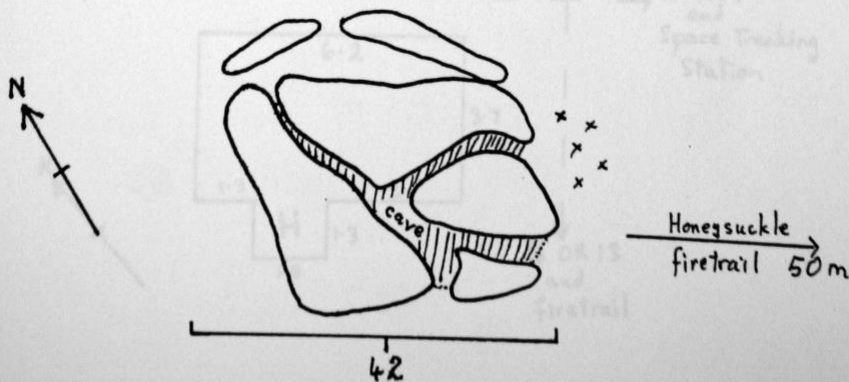
SITE'S LONG AXIS: 310° or 220° towards chimney

MATERIALS: Identified by shattered quartzite pebble and white quartz flakes (outside east face, *** in sketch) and by quartzite flakes in south entrance to cave.

KNOWN BACKGROUND: Constructed in 1949 as an overnight shelter.
Gregory 16 October 1977.

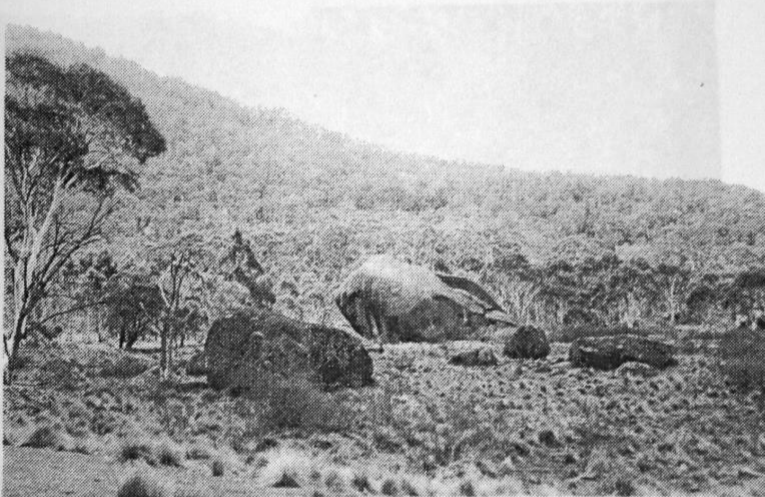
COMMENTS: Site is a very large split rock in a natural clearing with numerous springs. Bogong moths were found in the cave, which has been disturbed by wombats. The site commands a view of much of the Orroral Valley and is on the most practicable route from the valley to the Honeysuckle Creek area.

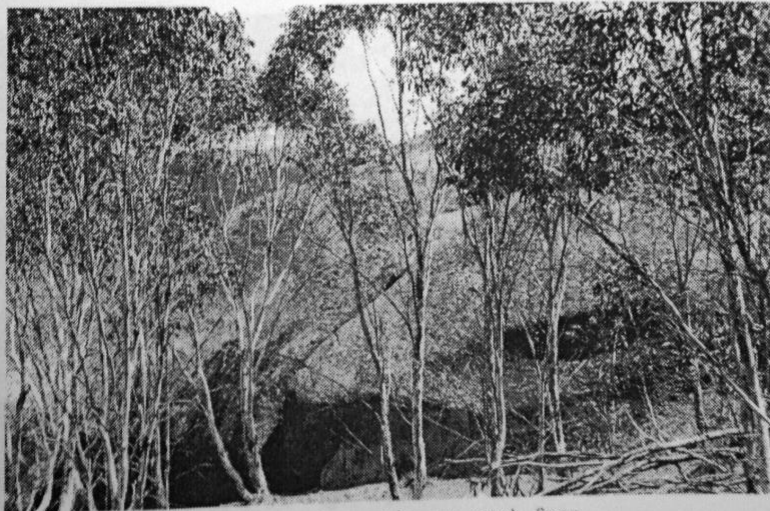




OR 10/north east/7.10.77/detail cave entrance
